What Is A Work-Ordered Day?

The Work-Ordered Day organizes the daily activity of the Clubhouse. Members regain structure while learning new skills, and strengthening personal talents and abilities. Members contribute to all aspects of the Clubhouse providing new and challenging opportunities.

Blue Unit

The Blue Unit is the business and kitchen planning unit. It focuses on orientations, meal planning, and essential clubhouse functions.

Gray Unit

The Gray Unit is the administrative unit. It focuses on employment, education, gathering resources, and job readiness skills such as reception and data entry.
